

From the Pastor:

Today, we welcome Paulist Father **Matt Berrios**, who will speak at all the Masses to inaugurate our **Annual Paulist Appeal**. As Fr. Eric Andrews, the President of the Paulist Fathers, has recently reminded us, by supporting our 2019 Annual Paulist Appeal you will help the Paulist Fathers to:

Build a new seminary building to train the next generation of Paulist priests;

Recruit and form Paulist seminarians and novices;

Energize outreach initiatives, such as *Busted Halo* and the *Openings* outreach to artists; and

Support and care for senior Paulist Fathers.

On Friday of this week, we will celebrate **the patronal feast of the Paulist Fathers, the Conversion of Saint Paul the Apostle**. By his own testimony, Saint Paul had been a zealous Pharisee, who had *persecuted the church of God violently and tried to destroy it*. In his own words, *I advanced in Judaism beyond many of my own age among my people, so extremely zealous was I for the traditions of my fathers, until he who had set me apart before I was born, and had called me through his grace, was pleased to reveal his Son to me, in order that I might preach him among the Gentiles* (Galatians 1:13-16). Transformed by God's grace into an Apostle, Paul's personality remained unchanged, and he was as zealous to evangelize the Gentiles as he had previously been zealous for the traditions he had inherited. A Roman citizen from a Greek-speaking city, Paul was well positioned linguistically and culturally to bridge those ancient divisions and unite different peoples in one new community centered on Jesus Christ. It was this evangelizing enthusiasm that inspired Isaac Hecker and his Companions to see Saint Paul as their model and designate him as their patron for the mission of the religious community they founded in 1858 "not only for their own sanctification but also to carry on common labors for the sanctification of others."

Saint Paul had what Hecker so much wanted his Paulist Fathers to have, what Hecker called **zeal for souls**. Paul's career as an apostle illustrates how completely Christ can captivate the completely converted Christian. Paul was not one of the original 12. He had not been there with them when *Jesus said to his disciples: "go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature"* (Mark 16:15). But he absorbed those words as surely as if they had been initially addressed to him – as we also must do.

For the Gentile, pagan peoples of the Roman Empire, Paul's proclamation was good news indeed. The world has changed a lot since Paul's time, but its need to hear that message proclaimed has not. As Pope Saint John Paul II famously said: **"Those who have come into genuine contact with Christ cannot keep him for themselves, they must proclaim him."**

Gospel Reflection

In today's Gospel, we hear the story of the Wedding Feast at Cana, where Jesus establishes the New Covenant. A hint about what this New Covenant will be like is made evident in the deed that Jesus performs. Asked to do something to address the awkward situation that the absence of wine at a wedding feast would create, Jesus' miracle produces vast quantities of wine—six jars holding thirty gallons each are filled to overflowing with choice wine.

This lavish response to a simple human need is a vision for us of the abundance of God's kingdom. It challenges us to respond generously when confronted with human need today. We respond as best we can, fully confident that God can transform our efforts, bringing the Kingdom of God to fulfillment among us.

He is known as the *Doctor Caritatis* (Doctor of Charity).

A Word from Servant of God Isaac Hecker, Founder of the Paulist Fathers

The Bicentennial Year theme for January is Hecker's Experience of God Directing his Life and leading him toward his Vocation and Mission.

"Several years' of study and effort in the way of political reform made it evident that the evils of society were not so much political as social ... Hence a social reform was called for, and this led me into the examination of the social evils of the present state of society. The many miseries and the great wretchedness that exist in modern society sprung, in my opinion, from the want of the practical application of the moral principles of Christianity to the social relations between men. ... Why should not those who profess Christianity imitate Christ in devoting themselves entirely to the spreading of the truth, the relief of the poor, and the elevation of the lower classes? Such like thoughts occupied my mind, and since a social reform was needed, it was my duty to begin with myself, and this led me to treat those in my employ with greater kindness, and to make important changes in my way of living." [A *Narration of His Life*, 1858]


