From the Pastor:

Thank you for your generous response to last week's Annual Paulist Appeal! By supporting our 2019 Annual Paulist Appeal you are helping the Paulist Fathers to build a new seminary building to train the next generation of Paulist priests; recruit and form Paulist seminarians and novices; energize outreach initiatives, such as Busted Halo and the Openings outreach to artists; and support and care for senior Paulist Fathers.

The **2019 Annual Bishop's Appeal** begins today!

Doing our part, both individually and as a parish community to support the mission of the Church has always been part of what it means to be part of the Church. In the letters of Saint Paul, there are a number of clear references to the collection he was taking up to support the Mother Church in Jerusalem. In doing so, Saint Paul was trying to accomplish two things. The Jewish Christians in Jerusalem were in real need, and Paul wanted his somewhat better-off Gentile Christian converts to help them out. But he also wanted the different local communities to understand that they were all part of one Church, all on the same journey together. That is at the heart of what life in the Church is all about. No one of us is self-sufficient spiritually any more than we are in any other way. We don't get anywhere on our own, but we can advance together as a community within which we care for and support one another, helping one another to do more than the minimum and in the process spreading the kingdom's frontiers farther and farther into the world beyond us.

Our parish is where we experience Church most closely, most directly, most intimately, and that is why we all love our parish and support it in so many ways, not just financial. But our parish is just one part of our local Church in East Tennessee, the Diocese of Knoxville, which is in turn one part of a Universal church with a world-wide mission. To advance the Church's mission, we all have to pull together as a local Church, as a diocese, to make possible the things the Church needs to do – the absolutely essential work of Catholic Charities, for example, which responds to so many human needs in our communities. Another is the formation of future priests and deacons, necessary if the mission of the Church is to continue into the future. The Annual Bishop's Appeal is not just another "special collection." This is at the heart of being who we are and doing what we are called to do in the world.

Many of you who have contributed in the past have already received a letter in the mail. Maybe you have already sent in your pledge. If so, thank you. If you haven't yet, you'll have a chance to pledge next Sunday. So please give it serious thought this week. Our assigned parish goal is **\$52,200**. With your enthusiasm and support, I am confident that we can reach and even exceed our assigned goal.

The Bishop's Appeal is obviously not the only thing we do as a diocese, as the Catholic Church in East Tennessee. But it is an important part of making all those other things we do possible!

1st Friday Exposition and Benediction:

The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed at the end of the **12:10 p.m. Mass on Fri., Feb. 1,** followed by the recitation of the Litany of the Sacred Heart and the Paulist Vocation Prayer, and concluding with Benediction.



Candlemas Day: Sat., Feb. 2, the 40th Day of

Christmas, is the feast of the Presentation of the Lord, commonly called Candlemas Day, because it is the day when the Church blesses candles and invites the faithful to carry blessed candles in procession saying: "So let us also, gathered together by the Holy Spirit, proceed to the house of God to encounter Christ. There we shall find him and recognize him in the breaking of the bread, until he comes again, revealed in glory." In this, the Church takes its inspiration from Luke's gospel account in which a holy man named Simeon took the infant Jesus in his arms and proclaimed him "a light of revelation to the Gentiles." That happened on the occasion of Jesus' Presentation in the Temple, which is what this ancient feast of the Presentation of the Lord, 40 days after Christmas, formally celebrates, marking the definitive end of the Christmas season. In Catholic countries, the Christmas nativity scene typically remains on display in churches until Candlemas. *All are welcome to bring a candle (or candles) to be blessed at Mass on Saturday.*



World Day of Consecrated Life:

Since 1997, the feast of the Presentation of the Lord has also been set aside as a special day of prayer for women and men in consecrated life. Just as on Candlemas Day candles are blessed symbolizing Christ who is the light of the world, so too those priests, brothers, and sisters in the various Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life are called to reflect the light of Jesus Christ to all peoples. Please pray that God will continue to bless his Church with abundant vocations to these communities (in particular the Paulist Fathers).



The 1st Saturday Rosary will be recited at the end of the **8:30 a.m. Mass on Sat., Feb. 2.**



Blessing of Throats: On Feb. 3, the

Church commemorates Saint Blaise, a 4th-century Armenian Bishop and Martyr, who was reputed to have healed a boy who nearly died because of a fishbone stuck in his throat. *The traditional Blessing of Throats will be offered at the end of each of the Sunday Masses next weekend.*

Saint Thomas Aquinas, Paulist Patron: On **Mon., Jan. 28**, the Church commemorates Saint Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274), Dominican friar and scholastic philosopher and theologian, most famous for his *Summa Theologiae* and *Summa contra Gentiles* and for the familiar Eucharistic hymns *Pange lingua gloriosi*, *Adoro Te devote*, and *Lauda Sion*. He is known as the *Doctor Angelicus* (Angelic Doctor) and the *Doctor Communis* (Universal Doctor). *The Paulist Prayer Book* (2000) includes the following prayer by Saint Thomas: *Grant, Lord, that I may gladly share what I have with the needy, humbly ask for what I need from him who has, sincerely admit the evil I have done, calmly bear the evil I suffer, not envy my neighbor for his blessings, and thank you unceasingly whenever you hear my prayer.*

A Word from Servant of God Isaac Hecker, Founder of the Paulist Fathers

The Bicentennial Year theme for January is Hecker's Experience of God Directing his Life and leading him toward his Vocation and Mission.

"The question then presented itself in this shape: either the truth is to be found in the Catholic Church, the place where it is supposed among Protestants the least to exist, or God will yet reveal it, for it is not reasonable to suppose that He would implant in the soul such an ardent thirst for truth and not reveal it. ... God at length conquered, and led me to make this entire renunciation, and to be willing to be poor, despised, and alone in the world. It was then that the Catholic Church burst upon my vision as the object to which all my efforts had been unintentionally directed. It was not a change, but a sudden realization of all that had hitherto obscurely captivated my mind, and secretly attracted my heart. On my reception into the Church no abjuration was exacted, since my assent was never given to any sect or form of error; and the only desire that occupied me was to devote myself wholly to God and His service." [A Narration of His Life, 1858]
