From the Pastor:

With yesterday's celebration of the Presentation of the Lord on the 40th day of Christmas, the Church's annual celebration of the mysteries of Christmas has come to its end. Symbolically we are at the mid-point between the winter solstice (Christmas) and the spring equinox (Easter). Simeon's prophecy in yesterday's Gospel that Jesus *is destined to be a sign that will be opposed* points us forward toward the season of Lent - although, since Easter falls at the later end of its cycle this year, we have another full month yet before the actual beginning of Lent.

Meanwhile, last week I spoke at all the Sunday Masses about the 2019 Bishop's Appeal. The theme of this year's Appeal is ONE SPIRIT IN CHRIST. Each gift to the Appeal will contribute to enabling the Diocese of Knoxville to continue our common effort to help build the Kingdom of God in East Tennessee. This is our In-Pew Commitment Weekend. We will hear directly from our Bishop about the Appeal, and then will have our own opportunity to respond directly. Many of you who have contributed in the past have already received a letter in the mail, and maybe you have already sent in your pledge. If so, I thank you on behalf of all those who benefit from the presence of the Church in East Tennessee and the many services it provides. For all the rest of us who have not yet done so, today is our opportunity to make a pledge through the in-pew commitment process. As I mentioned last week, our assigned parish goal for 2019 is **\$52,200**. With your enthusiasm and support, I am confident that we can reach and even exceed our assigned goal. Thank you for your prayerful consideration and for your generous response to help continue the mission and life of the Church in East Tennessee!

The Church's mission faces many challenges. Accordingly, all priests of the parish will be attending the Annual Diocesan Study Days with Bishop Stika in Gatlinburg this week from Monday through Wednesday, February 4-6. Looking ahead to Lent, in this bicentennial year of the birth of the founder of the Paulist Fathers, please join us on the first Saturday of Lent, March 9, from noon to 2:00 p.m., to reflect on how Isaac Hecker's understanding of what the Catholic faith offered his contemporary American society is still relevant in our society today. We will begin at noon in the church hall where we will watch Isaac Hecker and the Journey of Catholic America, then continue for another hour or so of discussion and concluding with prayer.

Jesus' statement that no prophet is accepted in his home town reminds us that it is often difficult to hear a challenging message from those who know us best, even if it is true. As you gather as a family, consider proverbs or other wise sayings that are familiar to your family ("Blood is thicker than water;" "All that glitters is not gold." Or my mother's favorite: offer it up for the poor souls in Purgatory.) Consider what these proverbs mean and whether you believe them to be true. Share them with your children and look for examples in your own lives that illustrate these wise sayings.

A Word from Servant of God Isaac Hecker, Founder of the Paulist Fathers

The Bicentennial Year theme for February is Hecker's Search for God (Reflected in his Diary, which he kept from January 1842 to July 1845)

"Yesterday, as I was praying the thought flashed across my mind. Where is God? Is he not here? Why prayest thou as if He is at a great distance from thee. Where canst thou place him. Think of it. Where canst thou place him. What locality? Is he not here in thy midst. Is his presence not nearest thee. Oh think of it. God is here. His presence is always, universal and nearest. Am I impious to say that the language used in scripture for Christ's expresses the thoughts of my soul. Oh could we but understand that the Kingdom of heaven is always at hand to the discernor." [Diary, April 20, 1843]
