From the Pastor:

In the Church's traditional calendar, which was in use for most of our history, today would be *Septuagesima Sunday*, the beginning of the pre-Lenten season and a reminder that Lent is really just around the corner!

The annual observance of Easter as the Christian Passover, celebrated with an all-night vigil that concluded with Mass, and was preceded by two days of fasting, developed very early in the liturgical life of the Church. By the year 330 we also have evidence of an additional 40-day period of fast prior to Easter, a practice which eventually became universal in the West and has continued (with many modifications) down to today. In Rome, Wednesdays and Fridays were the principal Lenten weekdays. Then Mondays also acquired a liturgical celebration. Finally the other weekdays got Masses of their own, with Thursdays being the last to be added early in the eighth century. In the traditional Roman liturgy, apart from the late-addition Thursday Masses, most of the weekday Gospels for Lent's first few weeks were taken mainly from Matthew, and the Masses mainly focused on themes of repentance with much emphasis on fasting. But, beginning with the Friday of the fourth week, the weekday Gospels were taken largely from John with an increased emphasis on the theme of baptism. Although the contemporary Missal and Lectionary no longer follow this ancient and traditional pattern, the two themes of baptism and repentance remain central to our celebration of Lent.

In the early centuries, the Lenten fast lasted most of the day, ending with the celebration of Mass in the late afternoon. In Rome the faithful would gather with the clergy and walk in procession to that day's "station church," where the Pope would celebrate solemn Mass. In the sixth century Pope Gregory the Great fixed the classic order of these "stations," and in the eighth century when the liturgy began to be celebrated also on Thursdays, new stations were added to complete the list. The stationary liturgy of the early Roman Church had an important impact on the traditional Mass texts for certain days. For example, in the pre-1970 Missal, the Gospel for the Thursday after Ash Wednesday was always Matthew 8:5–13, the healing of the centurion's servant, because the station for that day was San Giorgio in Velabro, location of the relics of the soldier Saint George. Likewise, on the Saturday of the 3rd Week of Lent, the station church was Santa Susanna (which was until recently the American parish in Rome). So the 1st reading at Mass was Daniel's account of Santa Susanna's old-Testament namesake. Since 1975, the seminarians at the North American College in Rome have organized weekday, early-morning English Masses at the traditional Lenten station churches. While studying in Rome in 2012, I had the privilege of participating in most of those station celebrations. As I wrote at the time: *There is something special about going to these venerable Roman churches in the pre-dawn darkness, walking literally in the steps of centuries of Christians who have visited those same churches on those same days, celebrating Mass surrounded by the relics and memories of martyrs, then emerging in the early morning light to continue one's daily work. It is a true experience of the communion of saints!*

As we listen to this Gospel, the Beatitudes jar our sensibilities. Those who are poor, hungry, weeping, or persecuted are called blessed. This is, indeed, a Gospel of reversals. Riches, possessions, laughter, reputation . . . these are not things that we can depend upon as sources of eternal happiness.

The Beatitudes are often described as a framework for Christian living. Our vocation as Christians is not to be first in this world, but rather to be first in the eyes of God. Talk to your children about things that might lead you to the Kingdom of God and those things that get in the way.
