## From the Pastor:

In our Paulist calendar, March 6 (which coincides with Ash Wednesday this year) is *Nuper Nonnulli* Day, the anniversary of the 1858 Roman Decree which separated Isaac Hecker and his associates from the Redemptorists and paved the way for the founding of the Paulist Fathers later that year.



### Honoring the Declaration of *Nuper Nonnulli* — March 6

*Nuper Nonnulli*, issued by the Congregation of Bishops and Regulars on March 6, 1858, takes its name from its opening words in Latin (meaning “Recently some”). This decree dispensed Hecker’s four American companions — Clarence Walworth, Augustine Hewit, George Deshon, and Francis Baker — from their vows in the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer, commonly known as the Redemptorists. [Note: Hecker had already been previously dismissed by the Redemptorists. Ignoring his dismissal, the Decree joined Hecker to their petition in respect to dispensation from the vows.] By this decree, the Holy See authorized these five to work for the evangelization of the United States under the auspices of the local bishops: to *labor by work, example, and word in the vineyard of the Lord, and give themselves with alacrity to the eternal salvation of souls, and promote with all their power the sanctification of their neighbor.* Thus, March 6 is a significant anniversary date for the Paulist Fathers and all associated with the life and mission of the Paulists. From Rome on March 9, 1858, Hecker wrote to his four companions: “The Pope has spoken, and the American Fathers, including myself, are dispensed from their vows. The decree is not in my hands, but Cardinal Barnabo read it to me last evening. The General is not mentioned in it, and no attention whatever is paid to his action in my regard. The other Fathers are dispensed in view of the petition they made, as the demand for separation as Redemptorists would destroy the unity of the Congregation, and in the dispensation I am associated with them. The Cardinal [Barnabo] is wholly content; says that I must ask immediately for an audience to thank the Pope. \* \* \* Now let us thank God for our success.” In the next few months, Hecker, Hewit, Deshon, and Baker organized themselves under their own *Rule* and founded what became the Missionary Society of St. Paul the Apostle in New York City on July 7, 1858.

Please join us on the Saturday after *Nuper Nonnulli* Day, March 9, from 12:00 noon to 2:00 p.m., to reflect on how Isaac Hecker’s understanding of what the Catholic faith offered his contemporary American society is still relevant in our society today. We will begin at noon in the church hall where we will watch *Isaac Hecker and the Journey of Catholic America*, then continue for another hour or so of discussion and concluding with prayer. All are welcome!



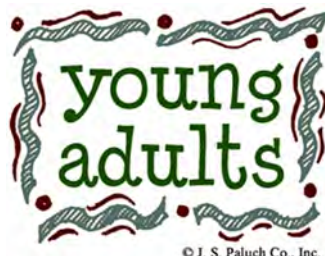

*The Bicentennial Year theme for February is Hecker's Search for God (Reflected in his Diary, which he kept from January 1842 to July 1845)*

"What the Lord will lead me to, for His presence is with me and directs my steps, what purpose or office or use, however humble, He may place me cannot be foreseen. Oh Lord, grant me humility, patience, peace and, above all, faith in they ever-loving Kindness. Oh give me calmness, restfulness in every trail of mind or body." [Diary, May 1844]
