From the Pastor:

Thanks again to everyone who made a pledge to the 2019 Bishop's Appeal during our in-pew commitment process last week or who has done so through the mail!

Tomorrow, the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, is also the Annual *World Day of the Sick*, which Pope Saint John Paul II established in 1992 as "a special time of prayer and sharing, of offering one's suffering for the good of the Church and of reminding us to see in our sick brother and sister the face of Christ who, by suffering, dying, and rising, achieved the salvation of humankind." The 12:10 Mass tomorrow will be offered for the Intentions of all the Sick.

In the New Testament, Jesus was widely recognized as a healer, who *went about doing good and healing* (Acts 10:38). The Church continues Christ's care and concern for the sick, practicing the corporal works of mercy in her many ministries of practical service to the sick, and in a special way in the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. In his Epistle, James famously wrote: *Are any among you sick? They should call for the presbyters of the Church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord* (James 5:14). Therefore, the Church offers this special sacrament to the faithful whose health has been seriously impaired by sickness or old age, and who are accordingly encouraged to receive it with faith and devotion. Likewise, a sick person may be anointed prior to surgery if a serious illness is the reason for the surgery. The "matter" of the sacrament is the Oil of the Sick, blessed by the bishop at the annual Chrism Mass. Anointing the sick person on the forehead and the hands, the priest says: *Through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up.* If the sick person recovers, the sacrament may be repeated if he or she becomes sick again, and it may be repeated even within the same illness if the condition of the sick person becomes more serious. The celebration of this sacrament often takes place in private but ought to be of concern to the entire community. In one of the prayers that may be said after the Anointing, the priest prays: *through this holy anointing grant N. comfort in his (her) suffering. When afraid give him (her) courage, when afflicted, give him (her) patience, when dejected afford him (her) hope, and when alone, assure him (her) of the support of your holy people.*

When death is near, the Church invites the sick to prepare by receiving Holy Viaticum, that is, Holy Communion accompanied by this additional prayer: *May the Lord Jesus protect you and lead you to eternal life.* All who are still able to receive Communion should receive Viaticum in this manner prior to their death. To the dying the Church also offers the Apostolic Blessing and the plenary indulgence which accompanies it.



World Marriage Day
February 10

There have been times in our marriage when we felt ourselves drifting apart. Not because of any one catastrophic event, but just because we weren't working on our relationship. We were just getting by. But in a culture antithetical to marriage, just getting by is not enough. All Catholic couples need to work to cultivate a dynamic, vibrant relationship, strong enough to bear the demands of family life, and weather everything the world will throw at it.

The reality is, we are never done working on our marriage. St. John Paul teaches us, "Love is never something ready made, something merely given to man and woman, it is...a task which they are set. Love should be seen as something which never 'is' but is always only 'becoming'..." This is true whether you have been married for 5 years or 50 years. We can never get to the point with our spouse when we say, "OK, now we finally have learned to love perfectly!" We never get there!

Take some time on to celebrate World Marriage Day by doing a "Relationship Check" with your spouse. Get away from the kids, from work, from the house and ask, "How are we doing?". Imagine your relationship as a separate entity (a tree is a good image). Step back from it and assess its health together. This isn't a time to point out faults or establish blame, instead it's a time to work together towards a noble goal.

You are the primary witness to the sanctity of the sacrament of matrimony. Your marriage is of vital importance not just to your family, but also to the whole Church! A Word from Servant of God Isaac Hecker, Founder of the Paulist Fathers

The Bicentennial Year theme for February is Hecker's Search for God (Reflected in his Diary, which he kept from January 1842 to July 1845)

"How does Jesus commune with humanity through the Church? ... He promised to be with his disciples even unto the end of the world. To send them the Comforter which should lead them into all truth. That he would intercede for us to the Father etc. The Church holds that is Sacraments and forms are the visible means of communing with the invisible. The answer of the Church is that there is an invisible grace imparted to the worth receiver through the visible forms of the Church; this is her answer. Is it true that such a grace is imparted? If it is it will be shown by its fruits." [Diary, November 15, 1843]
