From the Pastor:

As in past years, during Lent there will be a brief **Ecumenical Service** each Wednesday at 12:00 noon, followed by a simple lunch, sponsored by one of the five downtown churches. All are welcome to attend both the service and the lunch. This week's service will be here at Immaculate Conception Church, followed by a simple lunch in the parish hall prepared by the Immaculate Conception Women's Group. Note that this annual ecumenical service will replace the 12:10 Mass and confessions on Wednesday, March 20.

Today, the Church commemorates **Saint Patrick** (c.385-461). A Roman-British Christian captured as a teenager by an Irish raiding party, he spent some seven years tending sheep in Ireland. After his escape, he became a priest and bishop and was sent back to evangelize Ireland, the first major missionary outreach of the Western Church beyond the boundaries of the Roman Empire. He founded the Irish primatial see of Armagh in Ulster. He is the principal patron of Ireland and of Nigeria, is portrayed in one of the windows of our church, and is one of the special patrons of the Paulist Fathers.

Tuesday, March 19, is the Solemnity of **Saint Joseph**, the Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Patron of the Universal Church. In 1870, the year the Kingdom of Italy conquered Rome from the Pope, Blessed Pope Pius IX proclaimed Saint Joseph the Patron of the Universal Church. In 1962 Pope Saint John XXIII added Saint Joseph's name to the Roman Canon, and in 2013 Pope Francis added his name to all the other Eucharistic Prayers. Saint Joseph is also one of the special patrons of the Paulist Fathers. Under his patronage, the Church prays to Saint Joseph that, even as he protected Jesus and Mary from peril, he may now defend the Church from all adversity, and that, following Joseph's example and strengthened by his help, we may all live a holy life, die a happy death, and attain to everlasting happiness.

Also, March 19, is the 10th anniversary of Bishop Richard Stika's episcopal ordination and installation as the third Bishop of Knoxville. He has offered the following intention for this month: *Through the intercession of St. Joseph, whose feast day we celebrate this month, let us pray for a deeper understanding of why we are called to pray, fast, and give alms during Lent; and as we do, please continue to pray for me, and I will pray for you, as I mark my 10th anniversary as your Bishop.*

During this Lenten season, we will also again pray especially for those who, for whatever reason, are no longer participating in the Church's life. Feel free to write the name of any relative or friend who is no longer active in the Church in the special **Lenten Book of Intentions** in the narthex of the church near the baptismal font.

Lenten Abstinence: The norms concerning abstinence from meat, which apply to Ash Wednesday, the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday, are binding upon members of the Catholic Church from age 14

onwards. Besides those outside the age limits, the sick, the frail, the pregnant and nursing women are excused from fasting and abstinence.

Lenten Friday Fish Dinner and Stations of the Cross:

We will make the Stations of the Cross as a parish community every Friday in Lent at **7 p.m.**, concluding with Exposition and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. The Stations will be preceded each week at **6 p.m.** by a traditional Lenten Friday Fish Dinner sponsored by the Knights of Columbus, Council 645.

Wednesday Mid-Day Lenten Services:

As in past years during Lent, there will be a brief ecumenical service **each Wednesday at 12:00 noon**, followed by a simple lunch, sponsored by one of the five downtown churches. All are welcome to attend both the service and the lunch (or just the service). **This week's service will be here at Immaculate Conception Church, followed by a simple lunch in the parish hall prepared by the Immaculate Conception Women's Group.** (Note that this annual ecumenical service will replace the 12:10 Mass and confessions on Wed., Mar. 20.)



A Word from Servant of God Isaac Hecker, Founder of the Paulist Fathers

*The Bicentennial Year Theme for March is **The Church**. For Hecker, the spiritual search was never an end in itself. Hecker found fulfillment in the Catholic Church and desired to devote his life to helping others – especially other seekers, such as he himself had been – to find the truth in the Catholic Church. Thus, all his activity after his conversion was characterized above all by his enthusiastic embrace of the Church to which his personal spiritual search had so earnestly led him, and which would in time transform him into an active, enthusiastic missionary.*

“Hence the Church of Christ, as an organism, is the logical sequence of the Incarnation, and not an accident or after-thought of Christ’s mission to men as their Mediator and Saviour. The Church may justly be said to be the expansion, prolongation, and perpetuation of the Incarnation. Behold the method by which Christ fulfils His promise to remain upon earth unto the consummation of the world!” [*The Church and the Age*, 1887]
