From the Pastor:

Happy Easter! On behalf of the Paulist Fathers and the entire parish staff, I wish each of you all the blessings of the Risen Christ this Easter Sunday and throughout the entire year!

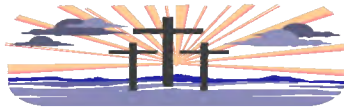
Easter Sunday is the highpoint of the Church's calendar. Saint Augustine famously called the resurrection "God's supreme and wholly marvelous work." Everything we believe about Jesus and who we are as his Church are all rooted in the fundamental fact of Christ's resurrection and in the Church's proclamation of that fact to the whole world. That, after all, is what the Church is for – commissioned to preach to the people and testify (as Peter proclaimed in today's 1st reading from the Acts of the Apostles) that Jesus really is risen from the dead and that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name. As Pope Francis has written in his recent post-synodal Apostolic Exhortation: *Christ is alive! We need to keep reminding ourselves of this, because we can risk seeing Jesus Christ simply as a fine model from the distant past, as a memory, as someone who saved us two thousand years ago. But that would be of no use to us: it would leave us unchanged, it would not set us free. The one who fills us with his grace, the one who liberates us, transforms us, heals and consoles us is someone fully alive. He is the Christ, risen from the dead, filled with supernatural life and energy, and robed in boundless light. ... Alive, he can be present in your life at every moment, to fill it with light and to take away all sorrow and solitude. Even if all others depart, he will remain, as he promised: "I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Mt 28:20). He fills your life with his unseen presence; wherever you go, he will be waiting there for you. Because he did not only come in the past, but he comes to you today and every day, inviting you to set out towards ever new horizons. (Christus Vivit, 124-125)*

During the Easter season, the antiphon ***Regina Coeli*** concludes Night Prayer in the Liturgy of the Hours. It is our parish custom to chant it at the end of Mass on each of the Sundays of Easter. This is the English translation:

*Queen of Heaven, rejoice, alleluia.
The Son whom you merited to bear, alleluia.
Has risen, as He said, alleluia.
Pray for us to God, alleluia.*

The Easter season is typically a time for special sacramental and other parish celebrations. Next Sunday, we will celebrate First Holy Communion, and on the following Sunday, May 5, we will have our annual May Crowning of Our Lady at the 10:00 a.m. Mass. As always, the 4th Sunday of Easter (May 12) will be the 56th Annual World Day of Prayer for Vocations. And our next Hecker Bicentennial event, **What Hecker Heard: A Concert of 19th-Century Music**, will be on Ascension Day, Sunday, June 2.

A Word from Servant of God Isaac Hecker, Founder of the Paulist Fathers

The Bicentennial Year theme for April is *The Church and the World*. In 19th-century Europe, the Catholic Church was struggling to survive against an increasingly hostile political order. For Hecker, the American experience suggested a more promising approach which recognized, accommodated, and, to some extent, celebrated, the separate but converging spheres of the spiritual and the temporal, religion and society, Church and state.

“Make a list of all the honest demands for ameliorations and reforms in man’s social, industrial, and political condition – it will not be a short one – and you will discover that they have their truth in the spirit, and are justified by the teachings and the practice, of the Catholic Church.” (*The Church and the Age* 1887)
