From the Pastor:

Today 9 children will receive their **First Holy Communion** at the 10:00 a.m. Mass. Congratulations to them on this blessed occasion, and a sincere thank you to their parents and to our Director of Religious Education, Brigid Johnson, and all the catechists, teachers, and others who have helped prepare them for this day!

Thanks to an outpouring of generosity from the faithful, the **2018 Diocesan Bishop's Appeal** reached a record level. This is yet another example of the generosity and faithfulness of our local Church, thanks to which, funding for critical diocesan efforts for Catholic Charities, Youth and Young Adults, Marriage and Family, Faith Formation, Campus Ministry, Seminarian Education and the Mobile Medical Clinic among others, will receive the support they so much need.

I am happy to be able to report that Immaculate Conception contributed its share to the success of the **2018 Bishop's Appeal**. Our parishioners pledged **\$27,455**, of which **\$23,710** has already been received. That plus an additional **\$25,108.05** in non-pledged collections equals a total received so far of **\$50,933.05**. So we are only **\$1,266.95** short of our assigned parish goal of **\$52,200**. Counting all the amount pledged, the percentage of our goal committed so far is **104.7%**!

For the **2019 Bishop's Appeal**, our assigned parish goal remains **\$52,200**. So far, however, only **\$21,105** has been pledged. That plus an additional **\$12,180.00** in non-pledged collections results in a total of **\$33,285** thus far committed, which means we are still **\$18,915** short of our goal. At only **64%** of our goal, our percentage is one of the lowest percentages in the diocese.

Whereas in 2018, **150** Immaculate Conception parishioners donated to the Bishop's Appeal, only **110** have donated to the 2019 Appeal so far this year. Of these, **31** are new donors, which means that **70** of last year's donors have not yet contributed to this year's Appeal. **The good news is that there is still plenty of time to contribute this year! So, if you have not yet contributed this year, I encourage you, if you are able to do so, to please contribute to this year's Bishop's Appeal as soon as possible.**

As I noted back in January, the Bishop's Appeal is obviously not the only thing that we do as a local Church here in East Tennessee, but it is essential to doing so many of the things that the Church needs to do, and which would not otherwise just happen on their own - Catholic Charities, clergy and seminarian formation, adult formation, youth, Young Adult, and Campus Ministry, justice and peace, and the St. Mary's Mobile Medical Clinic.

Finally, a special "thank you" to all who made our Holy Week and Easter celebrations so especially beautiful and prayerful – in particular, Karen Hoover and her team of decorators, Liz Horton, and Karl Jacob, Amanda Peavyhouse, and our parish choir!

A Word from Servant of God Isaac Hecker, Founder of the Paulist Fathers

The Bicentennial Year theme for April is **The Church and the World**. In 19th-century Europe, the Catholic Church was struggling to survive against an increasingly hostile political order. For Hecker, the American experience suggested a more promising approach which recognized, accommodated, and, to some extent, celebrated, the separate but converging spheres of the spiritual and the temporal, religion and society, Church and state.

“It is astonishing how much more liberal the Catholic religion is than Catholic people. Where is the Catholic man who will say that he is as liberal as his religion? The highest encomium that can be passed on a man is to say that he is as broad as the doctrines the Catholic Church teaches.” (“Baptized Democracy,” *Catholic World* 1886)
