## From the Pastor:

Today at the end of the 10:00 a.m. Mass, we will celebrate the *Annual May Procession and Crowning of the Blessed Virgin Mary*. **All those who received their First Holy Communion last Sunday and all others in the parish's religious education program are invited to participate in this wonderful procession.** A special "thank you" to our Director of Religious Education, Brigid Johnson, and all the catechists, teachers, and others who help make this annual procession happen and for all they do all year in the important ministry of passing on our faith to the next generation!

In the Western Church, the month of May is especially associated with various devotions to Mary – such as the familiar "May Crowning." As far back as the 13<sup>th</sup> century, King Alfonso X of Castile, in his *Cantigas de Santa Maria*, wrote about the special honoring of Mary during specific dates in May. In more recent centuries, the entire month has often been filled with special observances and devotions to Mary. In his 1954 encyclical *Ad caeli reginam*, Pope Pius XII created a feast of the *Queenship of Mary* to be celebrated on May 31 and marked the occasion by crowning the image of *Maria Salus Populi Romani*, the same image which Isaac Hecker visited while in Rome and which Pope Francis regularly venerates before and after his foreign trips. The feast is now celebrated on August 22 to highlight, as the Rosary does, the connection between Mary's Assumption and her position as queen. According to the Second Vatican Council's *Constitution on the Church*, Mary was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen of the universe, that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son" (*Lumen gentium*, 59).

Since the month of May mostly corresponds with the season of Easter, May seems an especially good time to highlight Mary's role in the post-resurrection Christian community: *All these devoted themselves with one accord to prayer, together with some women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers* (Acts 1:14), which anticipates her present heavenly role as Mother of the Church. The daily recitation of the *Regina Caeli* (in place of the *Angelus*) connects Christ's resurrection with Mary's role in the Incarnation as Mother of God and her intercession on our behalf as Mother of the Church. Traditionally, this prayer concludes the recitation of the *Regina Caeli*:

*V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia.*

*R. For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia.*

*Let us pray. O God, who gave joy to the world through the resurrection of Thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, grant we beseech Thee, that through the intercession of the Virgin Mary, His Mother, we may obtain the joys of everlasting life. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.*

In today's Gospel, Jesus again appears to his disciples but they only recognize him by the miraculous catch of fish after a fruitless night. Jesus has prepared the fire to cook their catch and shares the meal with them. He then asks Peter "Do you love me?" three times. Peter assures the Lord that yes, he loves him, and Jesus asks Peter to feed and tend his sheep. Do you remember that at the Crucifixion Peter denied Jesus three times? This is his reconciliation. Peter has been forgiven and given a mission. What is your mission? Your family's mission? Who do you need to feed?

### A Word from Servant of God Isaac Hecker (1819-1888), Founder of the Paulist Fathers

*The Bicentennial Year theme for May is Contemporary Holiness the Church and the Modern Age. In his preaching and writing, Isaac Hecker self-consciously sought and promoted models of holiness that he believed resonated well within the new context created by what he saw happening in the modern world.*

“Religion has nothing to fear from the ‘uncoverings of science’; for these will not prove in opposition to her divinely revealed truths, not identical with them, but will only serve to show more clearly their divine character and origin and their necessity.” (*The Saint of Our Day*, Sermon about St. Joseph, 1863)
