From the Pastor:

The Paulist Fathers invite all to **Hope Coast-to-Coast: A Virtual Groundbreaking with the Paulists on Saturday, October 17, at 8:30 p.m.** The Paulist Fathers will be virtually breaking ground for the new **Paulist House of Studies** in Washington, DC, on paulist.org/Hope as well as on the Paulist Fathers' Facebook page and YouTube channel. The **Paulist House of Studies** will be a new right-sized home for our seminarians, novices, and formation team, as well as Paulists who work in evangelization and ecumenical relations. Please register for the event at paulist.org/Hope. Your \$10 registration will enter you into the evening's raffle.

Meanwhile, Paulist Evangelization Ministries (www.pemdc.org) is developing a Catholic Discipleship Profile™ (CDP) and has asked us for feedback at this stage of the CDP development. This pastoral tool engages Catholics in a personal assessment of how they are living as disciples and then provides individuals with opportunities for spiritual growth. Please read the more detailed description in today's bulletin and follow the instructions to participate.

Also, as Election Day draws near, the Paulist Fathers have published **A Paulist Reflection for the 2020 Elections**, which "addresses the 'Signs of the Times' in our country since March — Covid-19, economic disaster, and racial unrest — and how those might impact our choices for leadership in our Federal, State, and Local elections." This document and related materials may be found at Paulist.org/vote. Its authors invite the reader "to discuss this with others, read broadly, pray and finally discern your own conscience, humbly but forthrightly." I likewise encourage you to read this reflection as part of your own process of political discernment.

Also very worth reading is a recent document from the Jesuit Conference of Canada and the United States on promoting the common good in the public square:

On a practical level, this pandemic has made many small and large demands on us – from thermometers and sanitizing equipment to expensive technological upgrades to guarantee our ability to continue to communicate and keep Mass available to all online. That is why I established **Fr. Ron's 25th Anniversary Fund for a Post-Pandemic Parish Future**, which so far has collected **\$3,040**. I have been very encouraged by this response. In this time when so many of us are stressed and stretched, I am especially grateful for your continued commitment and support, which will help guarantee the continued life and mission of our parish as we look forward to an uncertain future with hope in God's grace and confidence in one another.

Finally, please join me – either in person or on line – for my **Solemn Mass of Thanksgiving in Celebration of 25 years as a Priest on Thursday, October 29, at 7:00 p.m.**

Some Important Procedures for Attending Mass and Receiving Communion at Immaculate Conception:

1. Please follow the directions of the ushers when entering and leaving the church and when coming to Communion. Also please sit in the designated seats indicated by the green tape. Finally, please do not leave your seat except as directed by the ushers at Communion and at the end.
2. Please remember to wear your face mask at all times during the Mass. If you need a special children's size mask please ask an usher for one. The purpose of the mask is to protect those around you. So please wear it so as to cover your nose and mouth completely.
3. Please follow the ushers' directions when coming to Communion. Please come up the center aisle in single file, maintaining appropriate distance. (In other words do not come up two by two as was common prior to the pandemic.)
4. Before Communion, sanitize your hands. (Use as much or as little sanitizer as seems appropriate, but maybe not so much that you then feel the need to wipe your hands on your clothes and thus undo the effect of the sanitizer!)
5. If Communion finishes early downstairs, the Deacon will also give Communion in the church, thus creating two suitably distanced Communion stations in the front. Please go to the one that corresponds to the side by which you will return to your seat. Always return to your seat via the side aisle.
6. To receive Communion, please extend your hand as flat as possible. Do not try to grab the host with your fingers. Allow the priest or deacon time to place the host properly and reverently on your hand without having to touch your hand in the process. (If you move your fingers, you make it more likely that you will touch the priest or deacon's hand.) Pursuant to the Bishop's Decree, Communion is only administered on the hand, not on the tongue.
7. At the end of Mass, please follow the ushers' direction to leave the church as quickly as possible, starting with those in the back.
8. Finally, if you have brought your donation with you to Mass, please drop it in the box by the door as you leave.

Hail Holy Queen: While this pandemic persists, the cantor will sing the ordinary time antiphon *Salve Regina* at the end of Mass. Traditionally, the *Salve Regina* has been one of the most commonly used prayers in the Church's repertoire, apparently considered appropriate at almost any occasion. It seems a particularly appropriate prayer for this stressful experience in this period of pandemic. Since congregational singing is for the present discouraged, please recite it quietly while it is being chanted by the cantor. The familiar English translation is:

Hail, holy Queen, Mother of mercy, our life, our sweetness and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve; to thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Turn then, most gracious Advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O merciful, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary! Amen.

Special Parish Parking: Fewer parishioners are attending Sunday Mass now than did so before the pandemic, but many who do still park in the LMU lots on Locust Street and Cafego Place. For this privilege, we pay LMU \$300 per month. In the past, the parish periodically had a “Second Collection for Parish Parking” to cover this cost. If you make use of these convenient parking places, please contribute to our parish parking fund before our next parking bill becomes due on Oct. 1. 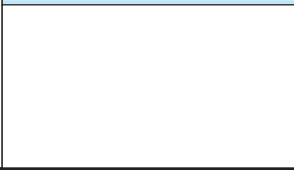
