## PARKING

**Free Sunday morning Mass parking** is available in the Eagles' lot across Cafego Place, the LMU lots on Locust Street and Cafego Place, and the Crowne Plaza parking garage. On weekdays, the **only** free parking available is our own parking lot. **Free parking for evening (after 5 p.m.) and weekend events** is available in the LMU lots on Locust Street and Cafego Place.

## Important Procedures for Attending Mass and Receiving Communion

1. Please follow the directions of the ushers when entering and leaving the church and when coming to Communion. Also please sit in the designated seats indicated by the green tape. Do not sit in the front row. Finally, please do not leave your seat except as directed by the ushers at Communion and at the end.

2. When the number of persons in the church reaches 50, all later arrivals will be directed to the lower church.

3. Please remember to wear your face mask at all times during the Mass. If you need a special children's size mask please ask an usher for one. Please wear it so as to cover your nose and mouth completely.

4. Please follow the ushers' directions when coming to Communion. Please come up the center aisle in single file, maintaining appropriate distance. (In other words do not come up two by two as was common prior to the pandemic.) Before Communion, sanitize your hands.

5. If Communion finishes early downstairs, the Deacon will also give Communion in the church, thus creating two suitably distanced Communion stations in the front. Please go to the one that corresponds to the side by which you will return to your seat. Always return to your seat via the side aisle.

6. To receive Communion, please extend your hand as flat as possible. Do not move your fingers. Allow the priest or deacon time to place the host properly and reverently on your hand without having to touch your hand in the process. (If you move your fingers, you make it more likely that you will touch the priest or deacon's hand.) Pursuant to the Bishop's Decree, Communion is only administered on the hand, not on the tongue.

7. At the end of Mass, please follow the ushers' direction to leave the church as quickly as possible, starting with those in the back.

8. Finally, if you have brought your donation with you to Mass, please drop it in the box by the door as you leave.

## From the Pastor

Were today not a Sunday, we would be celebrating the feast of Saint Luke today. Saint Luke is the author of the gospel that bears his name and a sequel, the Acts of the Apostles, which recounts how the life and mission of Jesus continue in the Church through the gift of the Holy Spirit, the ministry of evangelization, and the apostolic life of the Church community centered on “the breaking of bread,” i.e., the sacred liturgy, the sacraments, and above all the Eucharist. This fall, I have been meeting weekly with a group of young couples to study the Acts of the Apostles together. The apostolic Church remains the model, the inspiration, and the challenge for the Church’s life and mission in every time and place – including our own.

Each of the four evangelists is represented by one of the four “faces” from the vision the prophet Ezekiel experienced (Ezekiel 1:1-12). Thus, Matthew is represented by the image of a man, Mark by a lion, Luke by an ox, and John by an eagle. The ox recalls the animal sacrifices of the Old Testament. Luke’s Gospel begins with the account of Zechariah and Elizabeth and Zechariah’s service as a priest in the Jerusalem Temple.

According to tradition, Luke was a physician, which may account for his Gospel’s emphasis on Jesus as a healer of bodily and spiritual illnesses. For this reason, it has become customary in many places to celebrate a “White Mass” for doctors, nurses, and all other health-care professionals on or near the feast of Saint Luke. In this time of pandemic, we ought to be even more than usually aware of and appreciative of the vocation of those “essential workers” who work in health care.

Last spring when public Masses were resumed, there was a great emphasis on the need for comprehensive cleaning and sanitizing between Masses, which at the time it seemed it would be impossible to do in the short interval between Masses in the schedule we had prior to the pandemic. So we reduced the schedule to two Masses (9 a.m. and 11:30 a.m.), leaving plenty of time in between for cleaning. It was always assumed that, if and when attendance rose above a certain level, we would return to three Masses. Since then, increased attendance, combined with the imminent arrival of colder weather which will cause us to close the front doors for much more of the time, suggest that it will soon be time to return to a full three-Mass Sunday morning schedule. In addition, there seems to be some consensus now that the interval between Masses should be an additional 15 minutes longer than it was in our pre-pandemic Sunday schedule. So, after consultation with the Parish Pastoral Council and others, the parish staff and I have settled on this plan.

**Starting Sunday, November 1, our Sunday morning Mass schedule will be 8:15 a.m., 10 a.m., and 11:45 a.m. All three Sunday morning Masses will be accessible in the lower church. Both the 8:15 a.m. and the 10 a.m. Masses will be live streamed and recorded on the parish Facebook page.** Thank you for all your patience during these constant adjustments to the new world created by this pandemic! This experience has been very disruptive in so many ways. Hopefully, this will be our last schedule change! (It will certainly be the last in my term.)

## Paulist Vocations

Please keep Paulist seminarian **Noah Ismael, CSP** in your prayers. He made his first promises to the Paulist fathers on Sept. 4, 2020. Noah hails from Maryland and is a graduate of the University of Maryland at College Park. He served at U.C. Berkeley Newman Hall for the Lenten assignment of his novitiate year.

## Saint Isaac Jogues, Paulist Patron

On **Mon., Oct. 19**, the Church commemorates the North American Martyrs, Saints John de Brebeuf, Isaac Jogues, and 6 other French Jesuit and Jesuit Oblate missionaries to the Huron and Iroquois Indians in 17<sup>th</sup>-century Canada (in today's terms, the Canadian provinces of Quebec and Ontario, and what is now New York State). The most famous of them, Saint Isaac Jogues (1607-1646), is one of the patron saints of the Paulist Fathers. Having brought the Catholic faith to the Huron Indians, he was captured and tortured by Mohawks in 1643, but escaped with the help of Dutch settlers and returned to France the same year. After his return to America, he was martyred by the Mohawks at Auriesville, NY, on Oct. 18, 1646.

In addition to being a great missionary and martyr, Saint Isaac Jogues is considered the discoverer of Lake George in New York's Adirondack Region, where the Paulist Fathers have had their summer vacation home since the 1870s. He is believed to have been the first European to see Lake George, which he named "Lac du St. Sacrament" in honor of the Feast of Corpus Christi, May 29, 1646. (After it became part of the British colony of New York, the lake was renamed Lake George after King George II.)



## Box of Joy

Once again the ICWG is sponsoring the Cross Catholic International gift giving program, Box of Joy. Last year 75,797 children from Haiti, Dominican Republic, Guatemala, Nicaragua, El Salvador, Bahamas and Grenada received boxes. Our parish was able to send 232 boxes.

Boxes will be available in the back of the church and the parish hall during the month of October. **Last day to drop off a box will be Sun., Nov. 8. All dropped boxes must contain the \$9.00 handling fee (no cash).** Last year the ICWG spent over \$600 on postage and we will not be able to do that this year. You are invited to participate in the following ways: 1) Fill your own box, including the handling fee. 2) Join together with other people to fill a box/es and share the cost of the handling fee. 3) You may donate money for shipping (\$9 per box), items for the box, and/or gift cards to purchase items for the box. A tub will be placed in the back of the church for donated items for the boxes. Postage fee and gift cards should be placed in the church donation box or left at the office. Fees can be donated online. Please indicate the amount is for Box of Joy.

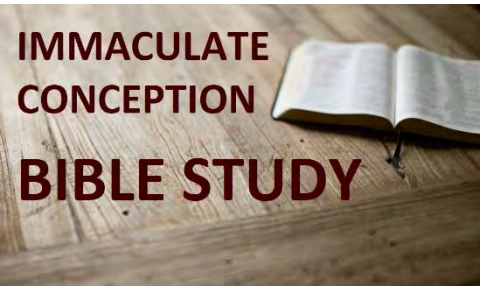

## **Is it time to resume meeting for Bible Study? Are you ready?**

I AM! In fact, I would like to start our next study the last week of October, or the first week of November.

Discussions with past participants have various responses. Some would like to resume meeting in person in the Hall. Others would prefer to meet online, possibly in ZOOM format. I would like to propose a compromise.

Meetings will be held on Tuesday and Thursday at the customary times (7 p.m. on Tuesdays; 10 a.m. on Thursdays) for those who want to meet in the Church Hall. Those in attendance will view the video, which last from 28 – 35 minutes.

Those who prefer not to attend in person can access the video online. (Access to the videos is included with the purchase of the workbook.) Participants will receive an email invitation to the ZOOM meeting early the day of the meeting with a link to the meeting. By going into their email and clicking on the link, they will be able to join in the discussion of the questions and answers that follows the video. I checked with Ascension Press to ask if it was possible to show the videos on ZOOM and they were not encouraging. They said that ZOOM would allow it, but the quality of the video was very poor. Considering myself technology handicapped, I asked someone for help and he agreed to help me try to find a way to do it. I will let you know if we do find a way.

I am offering the option of three programs and request some input from you on which you would prefer. I will go with the majority. The three choices are:

- ***Jesus: The Way the Truth and the Life*** - a definitive study of Jesus, filmed in the Holy Land and presented by Jeff Cavins, Edward Sri, and Marcellino D'Ambrosio (10 sessions) - Workbook with video access: \$29.95
- ***Hebrews*** - Ascensions newest, with Andrew Swafford (Romans) and Jeff Cavins (8 sessions) - Workbook with video access: \$26.95
- ***Follow Me: Meeting, Jesus in the Gospel of John***, presented by Edward Sri (8 sessions) - \$19.95

I am planning to begin meeting the first week of November, which would allow us to finish Hebrews or Follow Me (John) the week of Dec. 13. If we decide to do *Jesus; The Way the Truth and the Life*, we will break for the weeks of Christmas and New Years and resume for the final sessions in January.

You can order your workbooks directly from Ascension Press, or I can order them for you. If you want me to order them, please let me know no later than Oct. 19.

Please look forward to letting me know which topic you would like ASAP. Your vote counts!

If you have not used ZOOM and have questions about how it works, please get in touch with me. I am certainly no pro, but we are using it with great success with our RCIA participants.
