From the Pastor:

Yesterday, in Assisi, Pope Francis signed his new encyclical letter, *Fratelli Tutti*, its title based on the *Admonitions* of Saint Francis.

As the number of COVID-19 cases continues to increase, it is vitally important that we all continue to wear masks and maintain appropriate distance wherever and whenever possible. As CDC Director Dr. Redfield recently told Congress, masks may be our best defense.

Meanwhile, we have recently installed a \$2500 air filtration system and we deliberately try to keep all the doors open during Mass. Obviously, however, we will not be able to do this once the colder weather comes. All the more reason, therefore, for us to be scrupulous about appropriate distance and keeping to a responsible number those present in church at any one time.

In some places, people are required to reserve a place in advance or seating is allocated by lottery. I want everyone who wants to attend in person to be able to do so and to feel welcome in our church. We have been able to do this because on Sunday mornings we have a lower church, which makes it safer for people to assemble together at Mass because they can more easily spread themselves out. We can accommodate people downstairs with an excellent view of Mass being celebrated simultaneously upstairs and with Communion brought to them in person downstairs.

So, on Sunday mornings, when the number of upstairs attendees appears at or about 50, it is parish policy for the ushers to direct all new arrivals downstairs.

If our attendance continues to increase (as I certainly hope it will) we will soon return to 3 Sunday morning Masses. The reason we reduced the schedule temporarily to 2 Masses was to leave sufficient time for cleaning and sanitizing between Masses. Originally, we had no clear sense of how much time would be needed for this between Masses. Based on our experience so far, there seems to be some consensus now that, in order to accommodate cleaning and sanitizing, the interval between Masses should be about 15 minutes longer than it was in our pre-pandemic Sunday schedule. We have discussed this in the parish staff meetings, and I have consulted with our Parish Pastoral Council. At our meeting this week the parish staff will give me its final recommendation. If a change is going to be made, it will be implemented on Sunday, November 1, the same day as the autumn clock change.

Meanwhile, we still have non-pandemic related problems to address. For example, it turns out that we need to re-point brick joints at the transition stone ledge above the three windows of the choir loft, on the North face of the steeple base, approximately 45' above the side walk elevation. The mortar will match the existing mortar as close as possible. A stainless steel ledge flashing may be required at the transition to assure water tightness. This work will require the use of a 65' lift and will take 3-5 days to complete.

Some Important Procedures for Attending Mass and Receiving Communion at Immaculate Conception:

1. Please follow the directions of the ushers when entering and leaving the church and when coming to Communion. Also please sit in the designated seats indicated by the green tape. Finally, please do not leave your seat except as directed by the ushers at Communion and at the end.
2. Please remember to wear your face mask at all times during the Mass. Please wear it so as to cover your nose and mouth completely.
3. Please follow the ushers' directions when coming to Communion. Please come up the center aisle in single file, maintaining appropriate distance. (In other words do not come up two by two as was common prior to the pandemic.)
4. Before Communion, sanitize your hands. (Use as much or as little sanitizer as seems appropriate, but maybe not so much that you then feel the need to wipe your hands on your clothes and thus undo the effect of the sanitizer!)
5. If Communion finishes early downstairs, the Deacon will also give Communion in the church, thus creating two suitably distanced Communion stations in the front. Please go to the one that corresponds to the side by which you will return to your seat. Always return to your seat via the side aisle.
6. To receive Communion, please extend your hand as flat as possible. Do not try to grab the host with your fingers. Allow the priest or deacon time to place the host properly and reverently on your hand without having to touch your hand in the process. (If you move your fingers, you make it more likely that you will touch the priest or deacon's hand.) Pursuant to the Bishop's Decree, Communion is only administered on the hand, not on the tongue.
7. At the end of Mass, please follow the ushers' direction to leave the church as quickly as possible, starting with those in the back. Please do not congregate in the aisles or block the doorways when others are trying to exit.
8. Finally, if you have brought your donation with you to Mass, please drop it in the box by the door as you leave.

Paulist Vocations: Please keep in your prayers Paulist seminarian, **Christopher W. Lawton, CSP.** Chris entered the Paulist Fathers' novitiate on Aug. 25, 2018 and made his first promise on Sept. 6, 2019. Chris graduated *cum laude* from Harvard University, earning an AB in Biochemical Sciences, and from Columbia Medical School. He was active in campus church life as an undergraduate and later as a parishioner and ministry team member of The Church of St. Paul the Apostle. After living in New York City for years, he moved back home to reconnect with his family and enjoy a simpler routine while working as an Assistant Professor of Medicine in palliative care. He believes that rest and contemplation for his new phase in his life was needed to discern whether God was calling him to religious life. Chris trusts God and His plan for him. Medicine afforded him the opportunity to walk with people. Similar to medicine, he now wants to be a “vessel for people - - someone that walks with people in whatever God Experience they are made for.”

Paulist Fathers’ Necrology: Throughout the year, the Paulist Fathers remember in their prayers their deceased brother missionaries on the anniversaries of their death. This week, we remember **John Duffy** (10/5/1899), **Claude J. Collins** (10/6/1979), and **Gerard Aylward** (10/7/2016).

Saint John Henry Newman, Paulist Patron: On **Fri., Oct. 9**, the Church commemorates Saint John Henry Newman (1801-1890), an influential member of the Anglican Oxford Movement, famous convert to Catholicism (received into the Catholic Church on this date in 1845), author of an autobiography *Apologia Pro Vita Sua* (1866), *The Grammar of Assent* (1870), the poem *The Dream of Gerontius* (1865), and the popular hymns “Lead, Kindly Light” and “Praise to the Holiest in the Height.” A priest of the Birmingham Oratory, Newman was created a Cardinal by Pope Leo XIII in 1879, beatified by Pope Benedict XVI in 2010, and canonized by Pope Francis in 2019.

Pope Saint John XXIII, Paulist Patron: If it were not a Sunday this year, **Oct. 11** would be the Church’s commemoration of Pope Saint John XXIII (1881-1963), priest of the Diocese of Bergamo, Apostolic Visitor to Bulgaria (1925-1935), Apostolic Delegate to Greece and Turkey (1935-1944), Papal Nuncio to France (1945-1953), cardinal and Patriarch of Venice (1953-1958), and Pope (1958-1963), who convoked the Second Vatican council (1962-1965). He is one of the patrons of the Paulist Fathers and the patron of the other Paulist parish in Knoxville, on the campus of the University of Tennessee.
