Gospel Reflection

In last week's Gospel, Jesus told the rich young man that he needed to divest himself of his possessions in order to enter the Kingdom of Heaven. In today's Gospel, Jesus is warning his disciples that it will be an even more difficult path. It will require them to become servants: "Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Today's Gospel can be an invitation to consider how authority is exercised in our world. There is a temptation to exercise our authority in ways that show power over others. Especially when conflicts emerge, many of us rely upon the power we believe our role gives to us. Jesus teaches us that there is a more persuasive form of leadership. In these daily challenges, we have the opportunity to practice and teach the kind of service and leadership Jesus modeled for us in his ministry and in his passion and death. Where can you each model this in your own home? In the community?

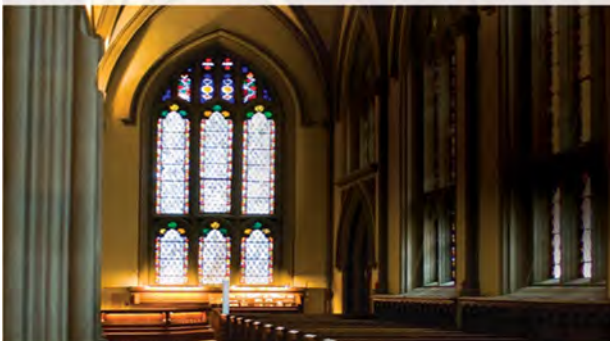
